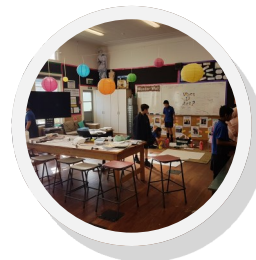

Digital Technology—Year 7&8 Linton Rathgen

Year 7: Students will explore the themes of Sharing the Planet and Who We Are and learn how digital technologies are used to support learning objectives around these areas. They will learn about the concept of gamification and the use of digital technologies for learning such as Education Perfect.

Year 8: Students will use digital technologies to create a design outcome such as a website or online learning game which will be linked to the transdisciplinary themes of Where We Are in Place and Time and How We Express Ourselves.

Visual Arts Jodie Faircloth

This term Year 7 Visual Art students will be working within the theme 'Who We Are'. They will be focusing on the art element of line, with personal inquiries on the patterns of different cultures. They will be engaging in a variety of activities, such as monoprinting, calligraphy and watercolour resist to build their skills before starting their final piece.

Year 8 Visual Art students will be working within the theme 'Where We Are in Place And Time'. They will be focusing on the art element of texture and will be inquiring into the effects that can be created when combining different materials. They will experiment with a variety of every day objects such as cardboard, sand and glue, as well as art mediums like gesso and molding paste. This will then give them a firm basis of skills to create their artwork.

Physical Education Greg Berry

The unit of inquiry will focus on physical development related to techniques such as throwing an object for distance and accuracy. Students will use self management skills and attitudes while also integrating the psychological skills of goal setting, imagery, centering and relaxation that are critical mental skills associated with performance in sport.

Performing Arts Jodie Faircloth

This term Year 7 Performing Arts students will working within the theme 'Who We Are'. They will be developing their dance and drama skills, as well as inquiring into other elements of performance such as costume and make-up. They will address the topics of changing relationships during puberty, as well as the physical and biochemical changes that occur within this time. They will then be making an educational video.

Science Danielle Biddle

This term in Science the Year 7s will be exploring Who We Are as their theme. The students will learn about their bodies and the biochemical changes it goes through during puberty, as well as systems of the body. During this unit we will do practical lessons including dissections, experimenting with heart rates and investigating the effects of different foods on our bodies. Students will be introduced to experiment procedures, fair testing and scientific concepts, finishing the term with an inquiry of their own. I'm looking forward to an exciting term!

Year 7: Students will be exploring the theme 'Sharing the Planet' with a focus on using materials they wouldn't normally consider in new and exciting ways. With inspiration from other product designers and materials students will follow the design process to create a unique recycled product.

Year 8: The theme will be 'How We Express Ourselves' with an emphasis on wearable arts. Each student will be able to explore materials in creative ways to make a wearable art piece. Students will have the opportunity to work individually on a small piece or work within a group to create a show stopping expressive extravaganza.

Year 8: After our in-depth study on Chinese festivals in Term 1, we will be linking the transdisciplinary theme of Where We Are In Place and Time to the study of Chinese fashion in Term 2.
